II. Propitiation

A. Jesus death served as <u>payment</u> of propitiation, <u>satisfying</u> God's demand for the sin penalty/debt

- 1. Through the blood of Christ Rom. 3:25; I Jn. 2:2
- 2. Satisfying the law Eph. 2:15; Col. 2:14
- 3. Applied to both God & man Rom. 5:10; Il Cor. 5:18-20

III. Sanctification

- A. The process of being <u>separated</u> to God, purification from evil and conforming to Christ.
- B. The Process:
 - 1. Salvation is the beginning point I Cor. 1:2
 - 2. It requires the imputation of Jesus' holiness I Cor. 1:30
 - 3. I must choose to avoid evil II Cor. 6:17,18
 - 4. I must be <u>conformed</u> to the image of Christ II Cor. 3:18
- C. The Timing:
 - <u>Positional</u> sanctification begins at salvation II Thess.
 2:13
 - 2. <u>Progressive</u> sanctification is ongoing Col. 3:8-13
 - <u>Final</u> sanctification is waiting for us in heaven I Thess.
 3:13
